

Cat's Cradle Treating Every Cat With Dignity and Compassion

Cat's Cradle adopts out hundreds of cats a year, and each of them go through a thorough vetting process by our veterinary partners before we help them find furrever homes. While many of our cats don't need extraordinary care, some do, and it's only with our community's support that we're can help these hard-up kitties find the peace and love they deserve.

Miss Stingray is one of those special cats that need extra care before they can be adopted. After Stingray's owner passed away, she was left abandoned. Thankfully, some selfless and compassionate neighbors kept Stingray fed and gave her water.

They soon realized Stingray wasn't keen on making new friends as she swatted and hissed at these new caretakers. And quickly enough, they found the cause of Stingray's hostile attitude: she was hurt and in pain.

To get Stingray medical attention, these Good Samaritans took her to the local shelter, where her cute round face and chubby body stole their hearts. They discovered Stingray had eye issues and other medical concerns, and the stress of being in the shelter intensified her anxiety and aggressive behavior.



Stingray needed help the shelter couldn't offer at that moment, so they asked Cat's Cradle to step in and get this feisty girl a medical exam and then into our incredible foster care network where she could be in a calm environment and get on the road to recovery.

Once in our care, Stingray's visited a vet who discovered she suffered from missing and decaying teeth as well as ulcerated, infected gums. Poor Stingray's eyes also caused major stress. She was diagnosed with the condition entropion, which is a rolling inward of the eyelids. It's extremely unnerving and painful because the hair around Stingray's eyes constantly rubbed against her cornea. With all those health problems, no wonder she lashed out at everyone!

Stingray's conditions required immediate attention to restore her quality of life, the Cat's Cradle community rushed into action. Because the vet bills for these procedures were high, we initiated a fundraiser to cover

costs. Stingray thanks you so much for helping her find relief!!!



After her procedures, she began to relax and became more sociable, but unfortunately, Stingray soon started regularly biting her tail which the vet deduced was from lingering anxiety issues. The vet prescribed some kitty Prozac which relaxed her and helped her develop an even stronger bond with her foster mom.

As of today, "Miss Ray" is still feisty, but in a healthy way! Because we were able to facilitate these surgeries, she's doing very well and is looking for her furrever home!



Cat's Cradle's Medical Assistance Program Helps Keep Pets and Their Families Together

Think of Cat's Cradle's lifesaving programs as three-legged stool:

- Spay/neuter (reduces overpopulation so unwanted cats are not taken into shelters)
- Pet retention (keeps pets with their families/caretakers and out of shelters)
- Rescue/foster/adoption (rescues those most at risk the cats in shelters - and helps them find permanent homes)



Veterinary care prices, just as prices for all other goods and services, are increasing. And some vulnerable members of our community, those who are financially distressed, unemployed, disabled, elderly, or experiencing various personal or medical emergencies themselves, cannot afford to get their



feline family members needed treatment. But they don't want to have to make the heartbreaking choice to surrender their pet to a shelter. That's where Cat's Cradle's Medical Assistance program steps in, thanks to local community foundation grants and generous donors like Gwen David and several other donors who wish to remain anonymous.

This program helps families get their cats care for a wide range of issues, from upper respiratory infections all the way up to major surgeries for such emergencies as urinary blockages. Cat's Cradle does not cover the full cost of care. Most clients pay a copay up front or pay the balance after our authorized assistance is exhausted and/or other resources are applied.

On page seven are just a few of the wonderful kitties and thank you notes from their families. This program is quite literally a lifesaver, and we are grateful to the grants and donations that allow us to help our community. But we need more donations targeted for this program in order to keep it growing. Won't you help vulnerable members of our community keep their treasured pets in good health and at home?
